## A Message from Our Pastor

### Let us begin again

"Let us begin again, for until now we have done nothing." This quote from St. Francis of Assisi reminds us that no matter what has happened in our life, year, month, week, or day, we are able to start again. Starting the weekend of September 10 and 11 Saint Jude will return to the practice of passing the collection baskets and processing forward with the presentation of the gifts.

The presentation of the gifts marks the beginning of the second major part of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This preparation also has been traditionally called the offertory, since the priest prepares the gifts to be offered. Despite the change in name, the essential idea and theology has remained unchanged.

The temptation here is to see the offertory as simply a transition between the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This step is essential theologically, and this is represented in the gestures and prayers that accompany the liturgical actions. It represents a shift in the emphasis in the Mass. In the Liturgy of the Word, we are nourished with the words of sacred Scripture, as well as giving glory to God through the readings, and are prepared to be nourished by the gift of the Eucharist.

The collection is brought up by a member of the community, expressing outwardly the gift of self on the part of the individual, but also the very vital role of the community in the liturgical worship. Accompanying all of this is a hymn or quiet music, which serves the purpose of fostering that sense of interior gift of self and community to the Lord.

*In general, going to mass currently is a relatively low risk activity, but some activities can be higher risk than others. Our parish safety procedures reflect those risks.*

**St. Jude to Resume the Offertory Procession and Collection Baskets at Mass**

As part of our gradual return toward normal practices, St. Jude parish will soon resume bringing up the offertory gifts and passing the collection baskets at mass. Many parishes are already doing this. COVID levels in Jefferson County are currently low - our last peak was in January of 2022 - but we will adapt our safety measures as future waves come.

Higher Risk

- Drinking from the same communion cup as an infected person
- Being coughed on or sneezed on by an infected person
- Shaking hands or hugging an infected person
- Receiving communion on the tongue if you are infected (can potentially spread to others)
- Shaking hands with Father after mass
- Dipping a hand into the holy water
- Passing the collection basket
- Receiving communion in the hand

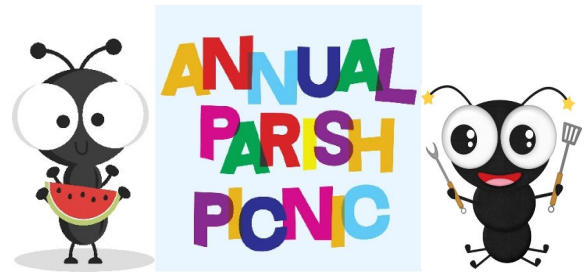

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?

**St. Jude's RCIA** program is a year round program. This model of formation provides a form of learning, centered on the relationship of the individual with the person of Jesus Christ and with his body, the Church. It centers catechesis in the primary place where that relationship is fostered and celebrated, in the community of faith that gathers Sunday by Sunday throughout the year. "Within the cycle of the year the Church unfolds the whole mystery of Christ, from his incarnation and birth until his ascension, the day of Pentecost and the expectation of blessed hope and of the Lord's return." This model also respects the journey of each person. It assumes that those who come seeking initiation will be welcomed whenever they arrive, no matter what time of the year that happens to be.

In this model of sacramental catechesis, the Church uses the language of journey, conversion, discipleship and relationship. Rather than a program of specific instruction, the RCIA suggests a fluid, gradual process of formation, the heart of which is the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ.
