Our Pastor

Trusting Humility

O God, be merciful to me a sinner. This prayer of the tax collector that we hear in today's Gospel is powerful. Sure, we all sin, and hopefully we come before God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, but how many of us have committed sins in such a way that a whole community hated and renounced us like this tax collector. He had turned his back on his community and was despised for it, and yet still came into the temple, where the people would have probably despised him the most, and have the humility to say just a few simple words "God be merciful to me a sinner."

His prayer is not one that he practiced repeatedly or something that he was told to go and do, but one that was completely spontaneous and from his heart. It is as St. Francis de Sales says, an act of loving repentance and desire to reconcile with God. This spontaneous prayer of the tax collector was genuine and an act of trusting humility.

There is that word again, humility. This is the 3rd time I have mentioned humility in these weekly writeups. And I don't think it is by accident. God is calling each of us to come before Him daily, not after we have made sure our hair is just right or after we have practiced what we would say to Him 10 times. But he wants us to come to Him just as we are, a humble sinner trusting in His loving mercy, striving to do His most holy will. So as we begin this new week, make a prayer (and repeat it every day this week) of trusting humility to God, knowing that His answer will be yes to "God, may I do your holy will today."

Interested in Becoming Catholic?

These are the last weeks to register for St. Jude's RCIA Program. Our model of formation provides a form of learning, centered on the relationship of the individual with the person of Jesus Christ and with his body, the Church. It centers catechesis in the primary place where that relationship is fostered and celebrated, in the community of faith that gathers Sunday by Sunday throughout the year. "Within the cycle of the year the Church unfolds the whole mystery of Christ, from his incarnation and birth until his ascension, the day of Pentecost and the expectation of blessed hope and of the Lord's return." This model also respects the journey of each person. It assumes that those who come seeking initiation will be welcomed whenever they arrive, no matter what time of the year that happens to be.

In this model of sacramental catechesis, the Church uses the language of journey, conversion, discipleship and relationship. Rather than a program of specific instruction, the RCIA suggests a fluid, gradual process of formation, the heart of which is the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ.

Christmas Pageant!


