Mary, Mother of God, Be With Us

Today we start a new calendar year, but this day is not any ordinary day for us. As Catholics, we celebrate this day as the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, the Theotokos. We must not forget our mother now that the Christmas season has begun. 

There will be snacks available. Running time is 1 hour 50 minutes. A free will offering will be accepted.


Eucharistic Adoration
