A Message from Our Pastor

REJOICE!

Happy Gaudete Sunday, which is our 3rd Sunday of Advent. *Gaudete* is the Latin word for "Rejoice." This Sunday we are called to rejoice—but why do we rejoice on this 3rd Sunday of Advent? We are not at Christmas yet.

Jesus gives a great reason to rejoice in today's Gospel when he gives a message to John the Baptist's disciples to take back to him. He says, "...the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" (Mt 11:5). What great news that is! John and his disciples would know that these things can only mean one thing: the Messiah has come!

Here, 2,000 years later, we know how the story goes—but imagine waiting for the coming of the Messiah and seeing many false prophets claiming to be him, and then finally seeing and hearing about the works of Jesus. You would be excited because you see the thing you have been patiently waiting for your whole life. The joy that would bring to you could not be contained. For us now, who know the story from beginning to end, it should likewise be exciting. We should be like a child awaiting Christmas morning, bursting with excitement—not for the gifts and decorations, but for the joy of the coming of our Lord in Bethlehem.

So, as you patiently await the end of this Advent season and joy of Christmas, let us rejoice. Rejoice, because what He brings should fill us with such joy that it cannot be contained. Rejoice, for we are almost there. Rejoice as you patiently await the fulfillment of what was prophesied long ago: the coming of our Lord to free us from our sins. Rejoice!
