A Message from Our Pastor

Do Not Be Afraid

"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home" (Mt 1:20). These words spoken by the

angel to Joseph are great words to reflect upon as we enter the last week of our Advent journey. Let's consider what they mean to Joseph and what they can also mean to us.

Joseph planned on divorcing Mary quietly—not because the child she was carrying wasn't his, but rather because he knew that the child was set apart for something great, and he did not feel worthy. So the angel tells Joseph not to be afraid and reassures him that he is part of this plan. And Joseph silently responds with his own "yes" by doing what the Lord had commanded him.

What can we then take from this *fiat* of Joseph? First, we too are called to welcome our Mother Mary into our homes. Much of this season of waiting and preparing is to welcome Jesus into our homes at Christmas. But let us not forget His mother. We welcome her into our homes now during this Advent season so that she can help us prepare our hearts and homes for His coming as she did 2,000 years ago. And then let us continue to welcome her into our homes during Christmas so that she can continue to guide us to her Son.

Secondly, we should learn from Joseph's *fiat* that we are each called to listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and be not afraid of what God may be calling us to.

Sometimes we are called to do great things that are a little terrifying and daunting. Joseph knows what that is like, being asked to care for both the Savior and His mother. But let us have the courage and fortitude of Joseph to go forth as the Lord might be calling us, no matter how daunting the task may be.

Do not be afraid of what the Lord is calling you to do in your life. And do not be afraid to welcome both Jesus and Mary into your homes this Advent and Christmas season.
