A Message from Our Pastor

Merry Christmas!

"I proclaim to you good news of great joy"

We have been waiting for the past four weeks for this moment: the moment that our God comes down to Earth and is humbly born as a little child in swaddling clothes in a manger because there is no room in the inn.

"He was wrapped in swaddling clothes to free you from the bonds of death" (St. Ambrose). His birth is not just a great excuse to come together at the end of the year with family members and unwrap gifts. His birth frees us from the bonds of death.

Many of you have had children at some point in your life. In those early months of your baby's life, you would swaddle them to keep them from flinging their arms everywhere and getting them into trouble. Our Lord was swaddled in this same way; He was bound so that we might be unbound from the bonds of sin and death. How beautiful is that, even as our Lord is only a baby, He is reversing the consequences of original sin.

"He had no place in the inn so that you might have many mansions in heaven" (St. Ambrose). We spent weeks preparing our houses for Christmas with lights, trees, and many other decorations. Maybe we decorate to help us feel festive, or maybe it is a sense of trying to prepare a place for our Lord in our homes when He did not have one on the night He was born. No matter the reason, we should allow those decorations to help us reflect on the place that our Lord has prepared for us—not on this Earth, but with Him in heaven.

Christmas is a great and joyful season not because of all the external things that we can enjoy, but because our Lord willingly and humbly came down to us to be one with us. Even now, He calls us to respond to Him and become one with Him. In this joyful season, I wish all of you and your families a Merry Christmas, and I hope that the time you spend with family is a time that leads you closer to our Lord and His call to become one with Him. I pray that you all have a blessed and Merry Christmas!
