A Message from Our Pastor

The Gospel of Life

This Monday, January 23rd, the church here in the United States observes a day of prayer for the legal protection of unborn children. And although the supreme court decision of Roe vs Wade has been overturned, we still are called as Catholics to pray for the unborn, particularly in our own state of Colorado.

The topic of abortion is not a new one to the Church, in fact we can see back in the first century the church fathers wrote a document called the Didache, essentially the catechism of its time, where they say that "you shall not kill the embryo by abortion and shall not cause the newborn to perish." (Didache quote in the Catechism of the Catholic paragraph #2271). This issue of the life of the unborn and newborns is and has been of utmost importance to the Church from her beginning.

We as Christians have a duty to care for those parents and their unborn children so that they don't feel that this new life is a burden before the baby is born and afterwards. But we are also called to spend time in prayer and penance for those who are at risk of abortion and have no voice. And so, I call on each of you to spend some time on Monday in prayer and penance for the unborn.

I am reminded of the words of St. John Paul II in his encyclical on life, *Evangelium Vitae*:

"A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer."


