# A Message from Our Pastor

#### **Beatitudes**

In this week's Gospel, we hear something we have heard probably many times in our

life: the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes compose the heart of the Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel—but how often have we thought about their deeper meaning and the challenge that Jesus offers us through this preaching?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that the Beatitudes respond to our natural desire for happiness (CCC 1718). Happiness is something we all desire, but what that happiness looks like seems to be different depending on whom you talk to. I would argue that, if you step back and take a look around, we seem to live in a world that is unsatisfied even with all the things out there intended to bring us happiness.

Jesus' challenge seems to defy what the world, even in His time, thinks happiness is. He says you will be blessed (or happy) if you are poor, grieving, meek, hungry, merciful, pure, a peacemaker, and when you are persecuted. Those don't seem to be things that bring happiness; rather, they seem like things that make us sad. But we must remember that God doesn't think like us, and our ways aren't like His (Is 55:8). Jesus challenges us not to live for the momentary pleasure or happiness, but instead to look to our heart that takes joy not in things of this earth but in our ultimate goal: our eternal beatitude with God in heaven. For "God alone satisfies" (St. Thomas Aquinas, CCC 1718).

I come to you then and ask you to accept the challenge Jesus offers through the Beatitudes. Read them again this week and reflect on one that sticks out for you. Is God calling you to mourn more (for our sins), or to hunger and thirst not for the things of this world but for righteousness, like the saints? Let's allow God to guide us to true happiness and to share in His own beatitude.


