

A Message from Our Pastor

Lead Us Not into Temptation?

We are starting our first full

week of Lent. Maybe you have already struggled with your Lenten penances, or maybe you forgot about Lent and haven't been doing anything. Wherever you might be on the start of your Lenten journey, the one thing we must remember is that we should not let our faults and failings tempt us to give up or do nothing at all.

Despite what you might think, God does let us experience temptation; it is what we do when we experience that temptation that really matters. In today's Gospel reading from Matthew, we hear about Jesus being "led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil." Experiencing temptation, as we see God the Son experience it, is human, and we should be prepared for it in our own lives. As Jesus spent 40 days in the desert before being tempted by the devil, we now have 40 days to grow closer in our relationship with God and prepare for the temptations that will come our way—including when Lent is over.

The devil knows how to tempt us. Whether it be through the things we gave up for Lent appearing more or through worldly thoughts, he knows what is likely to trip us up and get us to fall away from our Lord. But we need not be afraid of the temptations of the devil, for we are not alone. Our Lord experienced those temptations as well and He shows us how to respond. When Jesus was faced with the temptations from the devil, He rebuked him, telling him "Get away Satan!" We too can rebuke the devil when faced with his temptations to sin: we can call upon the name of Jesus to cast the devil away from us so that we don't give in. Call upon the name of Jesus this Lenten season so that you can turn your mind and heart toward heaven.


