A Message from Our Pastor

You are the Salt of the Earth

What is salt? Something that we need to make sure we don't have too much of

because of health issues, something that sits on the table when the food doesn't taste as good as you had hoped, or is salt something more than an afterthought? Let's quickly look at salt in two ways we might use it in day-to-day life and what that means for us as Christians.

Salt is purifying. Salt cleans out the impurities, the bacteria, in something and what is left is the goodness of that created thing. So too, as Mark's Gospel states, we should have salt within ourselves (Mark 9:50). We need that purifying power of salt within us to cleanse us from the spiritual bacteria in our lives, sin, so that we can be renewed in our creation as something that is very good (Genesis 1:31).

Salt draws out. When used in food, salt does a similar thing as when it is used to purify. It draws out water from the ingredient that it is being cooked with and makes that food taste, not saltier, but more like itself. Season a steak with salt and let it set for a bit and you will start to see water come to its surface. That steak can now taste more like itself. So we are called in this week's Gospel to go out and be the salt of the earth. We help draw out that water so that what is left is the image of God within those we encounter. We are called to go and spread the good news of Jesus and help people come to see who they truly are, created in the image and likeness of God, and in that creation they are very good.

This week, how can you go into the world and be the salt of the earth? Who can you help to realize their true nature - being created very good in the image and likeness of God?
