A Message from Our Pastor

Give Me This Water So That I May Not Be Thirsty

"Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again." In

today's Gospel, Jesus speaks these words to the Samaritan woman at the well—and He also speaks them to us. Jesus is not talking about water from a specific well somewhere in the Middle East. He's talking about the "water" offered by the world—those things the world offers us that are shiny, new, attractive, and yet always leave us wanting more. Eventually, that new phone will be old, and we'll want one with newer features; the popular new show will get boring, and we will look for the next story to hold our attention. The water of the world does not satisfy. The things of this world won't bring us new life.

"Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst." Jesus is the living water that truly satisfies our thirst. When the Samaritan woman asks for this water from Jesus, He first leads her to encounter herself. She must confront her past and present before receiving the living water. As we continue our Lenten journey into the desert, we too are called to encounter our own selves, both past and present. Jesus doesn't just want us to ignore our faults and failings, but rather to acknowledge them and bring them to Him.

One way to start that is by going to confession. I encourage you to join us for our parish Lenten penance service this Thursday evening @ 7pm. Let's allow the Lord to heal us of those attachments to the world and give us the water that becomes "a spring of water welling up to eternal life." As you continue your Lenten journey, I pray that you make time to encounter Jesus and receive the living water that will satisfy for eternity.

The presentation is titled "The Hijacking of a Divine Gift - How the Porn Culture Impacts You, Your Family and Society." Dann Aungst, President and Founder of

Road to Purity, a Catholic lay apostolate here in the Archdiocese of Denver will be giving the presentation.

Pornography use today is at epidemic, if not pandemic levels, and is quietly destroying our culture, our families, and our youth. Simply put, pornography destroys human dignity and God's gift of sexuality.
