# A Message from Our Pastor

### **Take Away the Stone**

Have you ever found some food container in the back of your refrigerator and thought

to yourself, "I have no idea what is in this, and I am a little afraid to open it." Then you take a deep breath as you open the mystery container (that has been there for who knows how long) in hopes of not smelling the horrible stench that has built up for weeks. Maybe you meant to take care of it but forgot; maybe you convinced yourself you'd take care of it "later"; maybe you were just waiting for someone else in the house to deal with it and the stench. Maybe we should listen to Jesus' words from today's Gospel and "take away the stone" (or old food container, in this situation). For the sake of your future self and your family members, just get rid of it.

Now this is a strange way to look at today's Gospel about the raising of Lazarus from the dead, but I do want to focus on Jesus' words: "Take away the stone." Jesus is calling each of us to remove the stone from our hearts that is blocking the stench that we have let fester through sin. He wants to enter our hearts, no matter what they may look or smell like. This Lenten season, He has been chasing after you, wanting you to make space in your heart for Him so he might bring you His light, healing, and new life.

So...do you let Him in, or do you object like Martha and worry about the stench? We can always find an excuse to not let Jesus in. Maybe we have failed our Lenten penances and have just said "I give up," or maybe we have fallen into the same sin repeatedly. Don't let those be reasons to keep the stone in place. Let Jesus in! He is persistent and wants to dwell in your heart, no matter what you have done or failed to do. He wants your heart, so let Him in, bringing you new life and joy.
