

A Message from Our Pastor

The Transfiguration

This week's Gospel reading may seem a little strange for the second week of Lent. Only a week ago, we were reading about Jesus being tempted in the desert after His 40-day fast—and now, we hear about the Transfiguration, a story that reveals the glory of God that we might more readily associate with Easter. But it is this change—from the desert to the glory of the Transfiguration—that we must focus on during our Lenten journey.

Whether you are having a great Lent or are struggling a bit, we are reminded by the Church today that this journey of fasting for 40 days has an end goal: resurrection. Our sacrifices and suffering ultimately lead us through the cross and to the glory of His resurrection. And although we are not yet celebrating the resurrection, we can remember that it is our lifetime goal: our eternal goal.

Even in this season of Lent, we can have a taste of the glory of heaven. Peter, James, and John were brought by Jesus up the mountain to experience His transfiguration, but they were not just experiencing some virtual reality of heaven. Rather, they were blessed to experience the true glory of heaven right there and then. We also can experience the glory of heaven every day in the Eucharist. Every time we come to Mass, we, like these three Apostles, get a taste of the heavenly glory, and it will set us free from turning inward and dwelling on the anxieties of this world.

So, I encourage you as we continue our Lenten journey: allow yourself to be set free of the world and enter the experience of the heavenly glory of the Mass that we are so blessed to experience, even while we are in the desert.


