

A Message from Our Pastor

Were Not Our Hearts Burning?

"We were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel." These are the words spoken by two of Jesus'

disciples after they had heard from others that Jesus was alive, not dead. They heard that He had risen from the tomb, and still they could not believe it. These two disciples then walked away from Jerusalem, sad and without hope. Two weeks after the start of the Easter season celebrating Jesus' resurrection, do we still have hope, or have we too turned away—sad and no different than before?

What a great joy to end our Lenten journey and enter the season of Easter, celebrating Christ's defeat of death and the opening of the gates of Heaven. But as the Easter season goes on, it is easy to fall back into the same routine and forget the joy we experienced Easter Sunday. We may have already forgotten this year's Lenten journey of growing closer to God.

In this Gospel reading, the disciples leaving Jerusalem are heading back to their normal life, forgetting all that they had heard and experienced during their time with Jesus. Then someone—whom they will later realize is Jesus Himself—walks with them, explains the Scriptures to them (Liturgy of the Word), and then breaks the bread (Liturgy of the Eucharist). It is through this experience, which is just like our celebration of the Mass, that their hearts burn within them and their eyes are opened to see Jesus present before them.

Jesus wants to walk with each of us, not just during Lent or on Easter Sunday, but each day of our lives. Can we, after hearing the Scriptures and receiving His Body and Blood at Mass, invite Him to continue with us during our week? Let us hold onto that hope of Christ's resurrection and let it burn ever stronger in our hearts to carry us towards the new Jerusalem of Heaven.




