



Pastor's Blog

Shrines of the Holy Land: Part 1

It has been said that you never know something

better than if you have taught it. Since I have never been to the Holy Land before and want to know about it, I am launching a three-part series on the Shrines of the Holy Land. I think that it will benefit me, those who will participate in our pilgrimage to the Holy Land next May, and those who will prayerfully support us while we are away. I would like us to consider the Church of the Nativity, the Church of the Annunciation, and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in three different weeks.

Today we focus upon the Church of the Nativity. As you enter the church, the first thing you will notice is the very low doorway. The entrance was designed to slow down the looters which pillaged the church in the 13th and 14th centuries. This doorway to the church is only about four feet high. Pilgrims who have come to the site through the centuries have found a beautiful significance in the bowing of the head in this place. The low doorway forces the pilgrim to show reverence in the place where Jesus was born. The church is called a basilica, as it is a major worship site for Christians. The structure which stands there today was built by the emperor Justinian in the 6th century. It replaced the original church of Constantine the Great, built over the cave venerated as Christ's birthplace, and dedicated in AD 339. (seetheholyland.net)






