

Pastor's Blog

Saint Jude: Pray for Us!

Today we can ponder
Saint Jude since the
annual celebration is on

the Roman calendar on October 28th. He was one of the twelve apostles, and, in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark, he is given the name "Thaddeus." Saint Jude may have been invited to know Jesus through his brother, James the Lesser. We are taught that Saint Jude was a cousin to Our Lord. Following the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus, Saint Jude preached the good news in Mesopotamia and in Persia, where he suffered martyrdom.

Devotion to Saint Jude has grown throughout the ages as he has become known as the patron of "impossible causes." In Baltimore, you can visit the Shrine of Saint Jude. During World War I, devotion to our patron increased greatly as the atrocities of war brought many souls to seek help where hope seemed lost. The Shrine of Saint Jude has a forum for people to share their testimonials regarding the experiences of the intercession of Saint Jude. One testimonial touched my heart and I want to share it with you. It was offered by a couple identified only as Roy and Janie from Texas who wrote, "Our son was in a terrible accident and had a severe traumatic brain injury which left him in a coma and in critical condition. He was in the hospital for 47 days. Following our Novena to St. Jude, our son immediately started to recover quickly and is now back at work. We are so grateful to St. Jude and highly recommend praying to St. Jude for anyone going through difficult times." Saint Jude... Pray for us!

Deborah "Debby" Dreiling



Fellowship of Light Parish Marian Consecration




Christian Service Committee






