Advent Candles




Candles for your home Advent wreaths will be available on Thanksgiving Day and the weekend of November 25th & 26th. The suggested donation for these candles is \$5.

The Fellowship of Light meets each Wednesday and the next meeting is November 15th at 9AM in the St. Benedict Room.



Pastor's Blog

To Jesus Through Mary

Saint Louis de Montfort made the expression famous, "to Jesus through

Mary." Saint Louis de Montfort was an 18th century French priest who encouraged souls to give themselves to God through the working of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He argued that the clearest and easiest way to get to heaven is through entrusting oneself to God's own mother. Although he died when he was only 43, his work of encouraging consecration to Jesus through Mary is considered spiritually normative. He taught that to consecrate oneself means to hand one over to the other. You are familiar with this concept in the Sacrament of Matrimony where the groom gives himself to his bride and the bride gives herself to her husband. Similarly, we give ourselves to God but through Mary's intercession.

Marian consecration can be done individually or collectively. We will collectively consecrate Saint Jude Parish to Jesus through Mary on December 8th at the 6:30 pm Mass. You know that December 8th is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and is a holy day of obligation. At that evening Mass, I will read the prayer of consecration and sign a statement of consecration which will be permanently displayed in the gathering space. In preparation for our parish consecration, the Fellowship of Light prayer group is doing spiritual exercises on behalf of us all. If you want to participate in the group's work, you would be welcome to join them. They meet on Wednesdays at 9:00 in the Saint Benedict Room.






