# Pastor's Blog

## Incarnation

You received your copy of "This Is My Body" at Mass today and we will

go through it together during Advent. For next Sunday, we are just reading the first two chapters.

I want to explain why we are focusing on the Eucharist in Advent. The answer is that Advent anticipates Christmas, when we rejoice in the Body of the baby Jesus becoming visible to humankind. In the Eucharist, we likewise rejoice in the encounter with the body of Jesus. At both Christmas and at Mass, we encounter the transcendent God made available to us here on Earth. We are made for this type of encounter. It can be said that the very definition of being human is to be a rational, social animal which is attracted to the transcendent and strengthened by self-giving.

The word incarnation captures this mutual rejoicing. The word incarnation means "to take on flesh." At Christmas, the whole Christian world rejoices in the gift of God's visible presence in a way that we can touch and feel. At the Eucharist, which is present at every Mass, we can touch and feel the Lord Jesus. This creates the opportunity to encounter Jesus. God wants us to encounter Him. Pope Francis routinely invites us to encounter the Lord Jesus. Ask for the desire for an encounter with Jesus. This encounter is not merely spiritual but physical as well. He will show you that you belong, you are loved, and He is real!


## **Quarterly Rosary Walk**


