



## Pastor's Blog

## Why Believe in God

"I know who you are - the Holy One of God!" This

expression was offered by the demon in today's gospel, and he affirms the divinity of Jesus Christ. For us humans, it is more difficult to even affirm that God exists, let alone that Jesus is God. It is as if a veil is on all of humanity which prevents us from seeing God, but the demons are not susceptible to this veil. The veil which prevents us from seeing God is called sin.

To show the reasonableness of believing in God, I would refer you to the "Five Proofs for the Existence of God" by Saint Thomas Aquinas. To bring his 13<sup>th</sup> century prose into a more digestible form, you might consider reading "Summa of the Summa" by Dr. Peter Kreeft. Allow me to present one of the "Five Proofs for the Existence of God" here: God is the unmoved mover. According to this reasoning, we begin by acknowledging that movement exists. That atoms move, or we move our bodies or that freight cars move is affirmed without hesitation. Then consider that nothing moves itself but rather that all movement is caused by something external to itself. The atoms are moved by atomic energy, your body is moved by muscles and freight cars are moved by locomotives. You can then ask what causes the atomic energy, the muscles or the locomotives to move and you eventually get to a first mover Who was not moved. We call that first mover: God.




