
## Confessions on Wednesday

The Lenten Penance Service will be on Wednesday at 7.00 pm. We will have 10 priests

available to hear your confessions. Since we will have step-by-step instructions on how to go to confession in a handout that night, I want to devote this space to "why" you should go to confession. I will address three arguments I have heard on why people excuse themselves from the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The first argument that I have heard presented for why souls do not want to go to confession is because they have already offered prayers of forgiveness in private. While such prayers are valid and even encouraged in the Church as a regular part of the examination of conscience daily, it falls short of the complete expression of reconciliation given to us by Christ. The "Me and Jesus" approach to reconciliation ignores the Church. Remember the words of Jesus who said to Simon Peter, "whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Mt 16:19) Your sin affects the entire community; your reconciliation must also be communal. The second obstacle concerns self-esteem. Some argue that confessing their sins might hurt the way that they perceive themselves. My experience has been the opposite: those who confess their sins regularly have strong self-possession. If you want to think well of yourself, be courageously honest with God and with the priest in the confessional. Finally, some claim that their personal relationship with the priest would change. Well, I'm flattered! The reality, however, is that I don't remember things from the confessional.

#### Why do we cover sacred images in Lent?

The tradition is to cover crosses and images on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Neither the Stations of the Cross nor stained glass windows are veiled. As the church approaches Easter, our Mass readings begin to focus more intensely on the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Families are also encouraged to imitate this practice and veil prominent religious images in their homes. It

helps us to
participate in the
liturgical season. The
unveiling before the
Easter Vigil is a great
reminder of our own
life on earth. We live
in a "veiled" world,
in exile from our true
home. It is only
through our own
death that the veil is



lifted and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives.


