

Pastor's Blog

Why did Jesus Need to Pray?

We have considered the other two marks of Lent in this space, today we should consider prayer. The first

mark of Lent we considered was almsgiving when I invited you to accompany me on a pilgrimage in May. The pilgrimage to Mexico is an expression of giving up something of ourselves to worship God. While we usually consider almsgiving as giving money to a worthy cause, a pilgrimage is an example of almsgiving. When we go to Mexico City, we will sacrifice our time and energy to worship God. We also considered penance, the second mark of Lent. I hope that you responded to my invitation to participate in the Lenten Penance Service last Wednesday.

Prayer is the final mark of Lent, and it is worthwhile to ask, "Why did Jesus need to pray?" Do you remember in Mark's Gospel we read, "(Jesus) rose and went out to a lonely place, and there he prayed" (1:35 RSV). I think that we can learn two lessons from Jesus' action. The first is that we want to be immersed in the love of the Father. At the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus prayed to the Father, "not as I will, but as you will." (Mt. 26:39 RSV) Similarly, we want to do the will of the Father so we should pray frequently. The second lesson we learn from Jesus' prayer is that we reengage our love for the Father through prayer. When we pray, we rediscover our identity as beloved sons and daughters of God!

difficulties and more. Stephen Ministers are currently available for assignment. For more information, call Gene Corley at 303-697-7058.



Why do we cover sacred images in Lent?

The tradition is to cover crosses and images on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Neither the Stations of the Cross nor stained glass windows are veiled. As the church approaches Easter, our Mass readings begin to focus more intensely on the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Families are also



encouraged to imitate this practice and veil prominent religious images in their homes. It helps us to participate in the liturgical season. The unveiling before the Easter Vigil is a great reminder of our own life on earth. We live in a "veiled" world, in exile from our true home. It is only through our own death that the veil is lifted and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives.


