Pastor's Blog

Why did Jesus have to die?

I trust that you have benefitted from Lenten reflections this year as you have journeyed to this week.

Our parish Lenten Mission and the podcasts could be such sources of inspiration. I came across the following reflection for Holy Thursday. It was beneficial to my soul, and I thought I would share it with you in hopes that you would appreciate its ability to give light to Holy Week. The testimony answers the question, "Why did Jesus have to die?" The answer to the question is because of love! Here is the testimony:

"A vivid childhood memory of mine occurred at Holy Thursday Mass when I was five or six years old. My older brothers were altar boys, and I was in the pew with my mother. The Mass neared its conclusion, clouds of incense filled the sanctuary, the priest was wrapped in the humeral veil, and I stood on the kneeler, absorbed in wonder. My Mom leaned close and whispered, 'they are taking Jesus away.' I did not know what that meant, but I wanted to burst into tears. It was not sadness or fear. It was utter wonder. I knew something awesome was happening and I was part of it. On Holy Thursday, Jesus 'loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end.' In the Upper Room, Jesus gave the Eucharist, the priesthood, and the command to live a while new way of life – a life of profound charity. Christ gave everything, totally and without reserve." (Fr. 




Knight of the Month, February 2024 Stanton G. La Breche
