



Mission Statement



The Good Shepherd


Our Lord Jesus calls Himself the good shepherd. In today's gospel He says, "I am the good shepherd, and I know (my sheep) and (my sheep) know me." (NAB Jn 10:14) It is not hard to imagine that the Lord knows us. It is harder to affirm that we know Him! This is because of original sin. Since the fall of Adam and Eve, our tendency is to wander away from God and become confused.

I propose that there are three characteristics of the sheep in God's flock that we should strive to live. Sheep (1) stay in their pasture; (2) they live as a member of the flock; and (3) they find the good grass. Remaining in our pasture implies that we are content with where we are, and we do not experiment with foreign fields. As a result, a Catholic would not experiment with Buddhist meditations, the New Age movement, or the Jehovah's Witnesses. Secondly, members of the flock remain with their pastor, bishop, or pope because they are members of the flock. Good sheep do not make their membership in the Church dependent upon the preaching ability of the priest, the personality of the bishop or the apparent faithfulness of the pope. Finally, sheep in God's flock can recognize good grass. Just as a sheep who is grazing eats the grass but not the thistle, so we recognize the Word of God and digest it so that we grow in spiritual strength!




Meals on Wheels is a




Knight of the Month, March 2024 Micheal E. Snider

Annual Mission Appeal Weekend

Next weekend, St. Jude welcomes Fr. Eugen Nkardzedze, Director of Development for the Catholic University of Cameroon as our Mission Appeal for the Archdiocese. Fr. Eugen sends us this information explaining this very special mission.

Most appeals for the education of children in Third World come in the form of requests for tuition support, payment of teachers' salaries, construction, and equipment for schools, etc. The needs of the Catholic University of Cameroon may



therefore sound a bit out of place but are very real and urgent; it is precisely the need for something to eat. Our appeal is to feed the hungry students and we are reaching out to the kind people of St. Jude's Church in the words of Christ: "Give them something to eat yourselves" (Mk 6:37).

Founded in 2010 by the bishops of the English-speaking sector of Cameroon comprising five dioceses, the Catholic University of Cameroon is located in the Northwestern capital city of Bamenda with a student population of over a thousand. Caught in the seven-year-long Anglophone war that has claimed more than five thousand people with over



a million displaced and property destroyed, one of the greatest needs of the university is an on-campus cafeteria that would cater to the needs of all the students and staff. Many times students and staff have run into difficulties as they searched for something to eat during school hours, and we have lost two teachers and many students who were abducted for ransom. Besides the security advantage, the academic, moral, social, and economic advantages of an on-campus cafeteria cannot be overemphasized for the general standards of living in the institution. You may not feed all the hungry in Africa, but you can feed some.

So says the Lord, "Give them something to eat yourselves" (Mk 6:37).


