



Eucharist in the Middle Ages

Last week, we examined the practice of Christian faith in the Early Church. We discovered that the Church survived the persecutions through the bravery of saintly Christians and Eucharistic celebrations became beautified when the persecutions ended. Today, I would like us to consider the Eucharist during the Middle Ages, which is generally considered to be the years 600 – 1300 A.D.

In this age, the growth of the monastic life created a safe place for the Church to worship God. Saint Benedict is the father of Western monasticism. The monks who lived within his monasteries were revered through the West and great communities like Cluny became universally known. With this rise of respect for the clerical state, the Mass became a "spectator's sport" where people would come to Mass but usually would not receive Holy Communion. "Worship was increasingly focused on the Eucharist, especially on the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, which was confirmed by numerous Church councils. The term "transubstantiation" began to be used, describing the change of the host and the wine into respectively, the body and blood of Christ in the sacramental form. However, the focus in the medieval Church was more on gazing at the consecrated Host than on receiving the Lord in his supper. The Mass took on more of the character of a drama to be observed, a passion play, rather than a communal meal." (The Compact History of the Catholic Church, 47)



St Jude Special Education Program

Religious Special Education is designed to help the developmentally disabled learn about Jesus. We work with the

students to celebrate their Sacraments and learn about Christian living in today's world. The class is designed to meet the needs of each student individually. We try to keep a 1:1 or 1:2 teacher/ student ratio. Material for each student is based on what the student will be learning and their level of understanding. Our students that have already received all their sacraments, go over the Sunday Gospels (they read the gospel for the upcoming Sunday), while others choose to study the saints, the Rosary, Mary, and other topics of our faith.

Each Tuesday, we start with large group prayer where we each share prayer intentions, then we pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory Be. After prayer, we break up into individual classes or small groups to go over the lesson for the day. We celebrate Mass monthly with Fr. Roland Freeman during our class time. Classes meet on Tuesday nights from 6:30pm to 7:30pm starting August 27th, in the lower level of the Community Center. For more information, please contact Diane Schreiber at 303-980-5504.
