25 Years of Prayer and Work

Today the parish celebrates my 25th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. It makes me feel somewhat nostalgic. As I look over these years of priestly service to the Church, I see two elements are present in each day: prayer and work. This theme of life in the church has been traditionally referred to in its Latin expression: *ora et labora*. Saint Benedict taught his monks that their daily lives in the monastery should be filled with prayer and work.

May I share two special memories from these 25 years which capture some exceptional moments of prayer and work? As an example of a happy memory of prayer, I remember the night that I read the entire Gospel of Luke! I was on retreat and woke up at about 2:00 am. I felt led to the retreat chapel where I started reading the Gospel of Luke before the Blessed Sacrament. In a little over three hours, I completed the book and went back to bed. I skipped breakfast so that I could sleep in! As an example of a happy memory of the work of being a priest, I remember a couple whose wedding I did in Fort Morgan. During marriage preparation, the topic of natural family planning arose. I had to work to convince the couple that they should not contracept and that they should accept each child as a gift from God. Today they have a happy family with 5 children... all girls!






