

Jubilee Year – Part Two What is a Holy Door?

This is the second in a four-part series reflecting on the 2025 Jubilee Year.

Pope Francis officially launched the Jubilee Year by opening the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica before Mass on Christmas Eve. He reflected, "Tonight, the door of hope has opened wide to the world...God speaks to each of us and says: 'there is hope also for you!'"

What is a Holy Door?

A Holy Door is a sacred entrance in a designated Catholic church that is only opened every twenty-five years during a Jubilee Year. After the year has ended, the doors are re-sealed. The ritual passing over the threshold of the holy door symbolizes passing into the presence of God. This is drawn from the words of Jesus, "I am the door" (John 10:7).

A non-Catholic visitor to St. Jude's shared last week that, when praying in our church, he felt he was in a sacred space – in the presence of God. What a beautiful reminder that, every time we enter the doors of our church, we enter the presence of God in the tabernacle.

Unfortunately, to be able to pass through official Holy Doors during the Jubilee Year will require a visit to Rome. (Road trip!). That said, there are several designated pilgrimage sites here in the Denver Archdiocese that one can visit to obtain the graces of the Jubilee Year. What is a pilgrimage and where are those sites? Stay tuned...



Presentation of the Lord Jesus

This feast day commemorates Simeon's famous prophecy that Jesus would be a "light for revelation to the Gentiles." It is also known as Candlemas and it is the day that candles are blessed for use during the coming year.

This year we will be doing something special at the 9 am Mass. We will have a procession inside the church with lighted candles to celebrate Jesus, the light of the world.

We invite you to bring candles from home to all the Masses on Sunday, February 2nd, to be blessed during Mass.

There will be a table to place your candles on before Mass – you might want to label yours in case others bring similar candles. Blessed candles can be used in your prayer space at home, lit during a power outage, or any time as a reminder that Jesus is the light of the world!



Feast of St. Blaise, February 3rd
