Light at the End of the Tunnel

Last Sunday, I asked you if your cross was too heavy. On this second Sunday, Lent begins to get difficult. The ashes on our foreheads have disappeared and the initial enthusiasm of our Lenten resolutions has begun to wane. We start to ask ourselves, "How long 'til Easter?"

This Sunday, Our Lord gives Peter, James, and John a great gift. He has already started to prepare them for Calvary. "The Son of Man must suffer and die...". They dread to think what those words might mean. Today, on the mountaintop, he gives them a glimpse of his glory. His face glows. His clothes become dazzling white.

Within a short time, that same face will be covered in blood dripping from a crown of thorns. That robe, once dazzling white, will soon be stripped from his back, reopening the lashes from the torturers' whips. The disciples will watch in disbelief as their beloved rabbi breathes his last on the cross.

On the darkest day in human history, they will remember that day on the mountaintop. And it will give them hope. John would later write, "We saw his glory". Peter, likewise, "We were eyewitnesses of his majesty." That memory would sustain them in the long hours from Good Friday to Easter morning.

Today, Our Lord gives us a glimpse of light at the end of the tunnel. When our cross gets heavy, we remember the mountaintop – we remember the empty tomb.


