




Mission Statement

The Ascension of the Lord He Leaves but He Stays

He could have stayed.

Imagine Jesus still walking the earth today – never growing old, teaching, performing miracles. We would have no need for faith – we would have Him!

But God's plan was not to establish an earthly kingdom. "My kingdom is not of this world," Jesus told Pilate. He told his disciples, "You are not of the world, I chose you out of the world." He consoled the Apostles, "I am going to prepare a place for you." We love our lives here on earth, but we are restless. We are exiles, longing for our true home.

It was God's plan that Jesus return home. Before he ascended, he raised his nail-marked hands in blessing, then a cloud took him from the Apostles' sight; the same cloud that enveloped him at his Transfiguration; the same cloud that overshadowed Mary at his conception.


Pope Benedict unpacked this mystery so beautifully: "The departing Jesus does not make his way to some distant star...he enters into communion with the living God...he is present with us and for us now and forever. His going away is a new form of closeness, of continuing presence."
