

# What do we have in common with the Broncos?

The Broncos are wrapping up training camp. 91 grown men gathered at Dove Valley in the heat of the summer to run around and beat on each other wearing full pads. Why would they endure such a thing? The answer is simple – hope. They hope to win the Super Bowl. We humans are willing to put up with a lot for hope.

Our readings this weekend are about hope. Abraham left his home and sojourned in a foreign land living in tents because he was promised an inheritance. Why? Because he thought that the One who had made the promise was trustworthy.

Pope Benedict said it beautifully in his Encyclical, On Christian Hope: "Redemption is offered to us in the sense that we have been given hope, trustworthy hope, by virtue of which we can face our present: the present, even if it is arduous, can be lived and accepted if it leads towards a goal, if we can be sure of this goal, and if this goal is great enough to justify the effort of the journey."

Jesus promised his followers, "Your Father is pleased to give you an inexhaustible treasure in heaven." And so, we walk by faith lived out in hope - the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Our hearts lie where our treasure is. And because of that we are willing to walk the difficult road called "Christian."

# St Jude Special Education Program

Special Ed is designed to help the Developmentally Disabled learn about Jesus. We work with the students to prepare them to receive the Sacraments and learn how to live as a Christian in today's world. The class is designed to meet the needs of each student individually. We try to keep a 1:1 or 1:2 teacher/student ratio. Material for each student is selected on their learning needs and at their level of understanding. Students that have received all their Sacraments go over the Sunday Gospels (they read the gospel for the upcoming Sunday). Others choose to study the saints, the Rosary, Mary, etc. We start with large group where we each (student/teachers) share who they would like to pray for. Then we say the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory Be, and we break up into individual class or small groups to go over the day's lesson.






#### **Serran Prayer for Vocations**
