

He's My God and You Can't Have Him



Has a homily ever made you angry? After one particular homily, Jesus' listeners tried to throw him off a cliff! He was preaching in his boyhood synagogue at Nazareth. Things were going great until he mentioned Naaman the Syrian. 900 years after the fact, the thought of this foreign general being cured of leprosy by the God of Israel still stuck in the people's craw.

This weekend God is healing leprosy. The first reading recounts the story of Naaman. His army had raided Israel and one of the captives was a little girl who became the servant of Naaman's wife. The girl told her mistress about Elisha who could cure her husband's leprosy. Naaman was indeed cured, and he worshipped the God of Israel for the rest of his life.

In the Gospel, Jesus heals ten lepers. But only the Samaritan – a foreigner – returns to give thanks to the Son of the God.

One of the most challenging elements of Jesus' message was that God was establishing a New Covenant – one that would extend even to the Gentiles. After 2,000 years of hearing that they were God's chosen people, Jesus' Jewish listeners were being asked to love foreigners as their brothers and sisters. God invites everyone to draw near to him. No wonder Satan whispers that "those people are not part of us." May Jesus give us hearts like his – open to all as our brothers and sisters in God's family.

## **OF INTEREST**

#### Signature Collection Drives at St. Jude Parish

The Colorado Catholic Conference of bishops support and encourage signature collection for Colorado initiatives #108 Penalties for Human Trafficking of a Minor, #109 Male and Female Participation in School Sports, and #110 Prohibit Certain Surgeries on Minors. These initiatives each require nearly 125,000 valid signatures within six months of their kick-off in early September to be placed on the 2026 Colorado ballot.

To that end, we have issued a letter to the Catholic faithful explaining the ballot initiatives and the need for Catholics who are registered to vote in Colorado to sign the petitions, and if able, volunteer to collect signatures. Protect Kids Colorado is a partner of the Colorado Catholic Conference and the sponsor of all three parental rights initiatives. They are organizing the effort to collect signatures across the state. We will be collecting signatures at St. Jude for one more weekend:

November 1-2, the weekend of All Saints and All Souls Feast Days
