## Epiphany - What the Magi Teach Us



This weekend we join the magi in adoration of the newborn King. These wise men from the East have something to teach us about encountering Jesus.

- 1. They looked up: How many people were so busy with their everyday lives that they never even noticed the star? The magi looked up to the heavens and saw the star at its rising.
- 2. They left home: How many people saw the star but then returned to their routines? The magi left everything behind to follow the star.
- 3. They encountered the unexpected: The magi came expecting to find a newborn king in a palace but instead recognized Him lying in a manger.


