

Pastor's Blog

The Baptism of the Lord



"The soldier baptizes his king, the servant his Lord, John his savior; the waters of the Jordan tremble, a dove hovers as a sign of witness, and the voice of the Father is heard: This is my Son."

That beautiful antiphon accompanies the first psalm of Morning Prayer on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

This weekend we come to the end of the Christmas season and begin Ordinary Time. The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River marks the end of Our Lord's private life and the beginning of his public ministry. Bishop Sheen reflected, "He went down into the waters known only as the Son of Mary, he emerged to be called the Son of God."

Of all the repentant sinners that came to the Jordan River, Jesus was the only person who didn't need baptism. John hesitated, but Jesus insisted. The Catechism states, "Our Lord's consent to be baptized is his acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's suffering servant. He allows himself to be numbered among sinners." (CCC 536)

Jesus emerges from the water and humanity gets its first glimpse of the Trinity. The Holy Spirit descends upon the Son of God and the voice of the Father resounds from heaven. Just like at the Jordan River two thousand years ago, on the day you and I were baptized, our Heavenly Father looked upon us with love and said, "This is my beloved child." What a precious gift.
